raise and thanks be to the Lord who founded the Birmingham place of worship! As early as the first half of the 1980's, many overseas students studied at the universities in Birmingham. The nearest church was in Leicester and these student believers had to take an hour's train journey to attend services there.

In the 90's two sisters and their families each settled in Birmingham. They were visited only sporadically by church workers, but for many reasons they rarely attended church services. After the year 2000, several believers who were asylum seekers from mainland China were settled by the authorities in and around Birmingham. They gradually found jobs in the area and many children accompanied their mothers to attend Sabbath services at the Leicester church. Regrettably most of the brothers had to work on the Sabbath and could not take time to attend services. Knowing this main obstacle, a group of fervent believers requested the Leicester church to lead services every other Tuesday, a day when most believers had a day off. After many attempts to find a suitable location we eventually secured a room within the St Martin in the Bull Ring Church in Birmingham town centre. From March 2009, services were held between 2 to 4pm on alternate Tuesdays. Around ten members within the vicinity initially attended the services and they often invited their friends to join them. Gradually

the number increased to twenty and since then the fortnightly Tuesday services have been on-going. Sometimes the brethren met at brother Yi-Xiang Cao's place for tea and fellowship after services and gradually this evolved as the gathering place after the Tuesday services. The service was led by the Leicester Church members to start with, but gradually some overseas students helped to lead the services as well.

Sometime in 2010, while on their train journey from Birmingham to Leicester for a Sabbath service two sisters were inspired to raise the idea of having Sabbath services in Birmingham. The arrangement would enable more believers to attend services on the Sabbath. With the agreement of the Leicester Church Board and the local members, brother Cao's family agreed to host the services at their home. With much excitement and thanks giving the first Sabbath service in Birmingham was held in October 2010, attended by eleven members including five adults and six children.

The service began with hymnal singing, followed by prayer and by watching and listening to online sermon streaming and bible study. The bible study was led by the local members with some assistance from visiting members from Taiwan and Malaysia. Later on, Leicester church and London church were jointly assigned to visit and sermonise.

The membership continued to increase as the children were growing up. In November 2011, we started Religious Education (RE) classes as the children were having trouble understanding the sermons from the main service. At that time sister Iris Chan from Hong Kong was taking her Master degree studies in Education at Birmingham University; she trained some mothers on how to teach RE.

With God's providence the membership continued to increase daily and it was not possible to accommodate everyone in the original meeting place. After many discussions, we decided to rent a unit within a light industry building in June 2013. However, we received many complaints over the noise of our prayers and of the children. In addition, the rent had increased relentlessly and we decided that it was time to look for a suitable church building for our services and RE lessons, and for facilitating evangelical work. We established a building fund and started looking for suitable premises.

many other buildings but none had come into fruition. The same member accidentally returned to the website of the estate agency advertising the property we were interested in. Surprisingly the same property reappeared on the market. This member was perplexed and after further enquiry he was told that the transaction fell through because the buyer failed to secure the finance. He was told another buyer was interested and was waiting for mortgage approval. Believing that God had reserved this place for us this member sought approval of the board members and the congregation and made an offer to the estate agent. The seller decided to sell it to whoever was able to complete the transaction by the end of September that year.

We experienced many challenges and unpredictable obstacles during the purchase but we thank God for His guidance and help in response to the diligent prayers of the congregation. With a lot of help from the other UK churches and the offerings of the local members, we finally completed the purchase of this church building. Moreover we had secured sufficient fund for refurbishment. After two months of refurbishment costing £60,000, we moved into the building in March 2016.

God has been guiding us step by step over the years. We started with nothing and we

We viewed many places in our search but they were unsuitable, either because they were too expensive or too far away from the city centre. In 2014 we stumbled across (in hindsight, God provided) a detached church building not far from the city centre and the price was affordable. However, we were told that the sale had been agreed to another purchaser and the sale transaction was in earnest. The member responsible was discouraged because of this loss. Another year went past and we viewed

The Brothers Fellowship and Sisters Fellowship jointly organised a visit to Leicester church on 18th September. During the fellowship


